

New Member Brings New Ideas For HH Reunion

Our newest member Dennis Jones, a Hunter from VW-4 in the mid-1960s, has taken it on himself to offer something that many Hunters have asked for every year since Bill Reynolds closed his concession several years ago – Hurricane Hunter T-Shirts.

As seen in the picture above, the shirts carry the VW-4 logo and identify the wearer as being associated with the World Famous U.S. Navy Hurricane Hunters (yes, wives, children, and grandchildren will want them too). On the front, the shirts can be personalized with name, insignia, and Hurricane Hunters identity. To date Dennis has insignia for Air Crew and Pilots. He is working on getting Meteorologist's and Naval Flight Officer insignia.

The shirts are high-quality, made of 100% cotton, and are available in a variety of colors. The shirts will be available in a variety of colors that will be described in our next Newsletter along with ordering information and Reunion Registration Forms.

Dennis is looking at two production methods and prices for the shirts, depending upon the response he

receives to his proposal. If response is tepid, he will provide ordering information directly to the respondent and each individual will be responsible for contacting the manufacturer directly. Those limited-run shirts will be digitally printed as shown in the pictures above, and the purchaser will pay for the shirt plus postage which is estimated to be around \$30 per shirt.

If the response is for fifty-or-more T-Shirts, the backs of the shirts will be printed with the higher quality silk screen process and the shipping will be free. Estimated price for the bulk-order shirts is around \$25 per shirt. All shirts, regardless of printing process used, will be personalized with name and choice of insignia

JAX Team On-Track For 2016 Reunion At Our New "Official Home Hotel"

In the Winter 2015 Newsletter we reported that due to changing demographics, a less-than-helpful reception by the new management at the Naval Aviation Museum, and a disappointing turn-out for the 2015 Reunion in Pensacola, Florida, the decision was made by our officers and directors to hold future reunions in the Jacksonville, Florida, area. officers and directors also discussed and agreed to pursue the establishment of an "Official Home Hotel" in much the same way civic organizations such as Rotary, Kiwanis, or the Lions Club have Official Home Hotels or Restaurants where they can always count on having a reserved meeting place at the same time each week or month and the hotel or restaurant can count on the same business each week or month.

The officers and directors agreed that the best plan was to approach a hotel, hopefully the Crowne Plaza, now DoubleTree Riverfront, site of our very successful 2014 Reunion, with the proposal that in exchange for setting aside the same time frame each year for our reunion, we would guarantee to hold our Annual Banquet in that hotel, rent space for our "Ready Room" for the duration of our stay, and secure as many rooms as possible for attending members.

Our President E.R. Eaton and our Jacksonville Team consisting of Juan Blanco, Vice President, and Arvid Nelson, Secretary, looked at and discussed their proposal to several hotels in the Jacksonville area and finally reached an agreement with the DoubleTree by Hilton Hotels Riverfront to establish the DoubleTree Riverfront as our official home. Having been burned by not meeting our contractual guarantee for occupied rooms in Pensacola last year, the Jacksonville Team made it clear to the DoubleTree management that since we are an organization of diminishing membership, we could not guarantee a set number of rooms, but could guarantee having our banquet and ready room in their hotel each year and that we would fill as many rooms as possible. For

that the DoubleTree would likely receive a plaque to be presented by our President at the 2016 Reunion naming the Jacksonville, Florida, DoubleTree Riverfront "The Official Home of the World Famous U.S. Navy Hurricane Hunters" and all the bragging rights that go with it.

Meanwhile, the Jacksonville Team ably assisted by CDR Tom Hampton, the individual who has supplied the engraved pens for attendees at previous Reunions, and Dennis C. "DC" Jones continue to work out details for the reunion such as the Wine-and-Cheese Party, refreshments for the Ready Room, menus for the banquet, as well as speakers and entertainment, and proposed activities attending Hunters may want to pursue during their free time at the Reunion.

In addition to his work with the Jacksonville Team, "DC" Jones has designed and arranged for the manufacture and purchase of Hurricane Hunter T-Shirts and has established an informal VW-4 web page on facebook.
